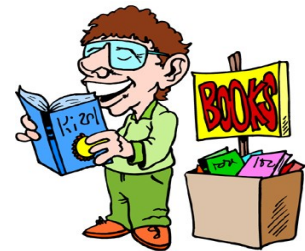

The KAL Annual Fall Book sale will be Friday, September 14, from 8 am - 4 pm and Saturday, September 15, from 8 am - 2 pm. There will be a special presale for Kimberling Area Library Association members only on Thursday September 13 from 4 pm - 6 pm. The book sale is a major fundraiser for the library, and we hope each of you will help us make this a successful sale.

There will be thousands of books included in the sale from popular fiction, paperbacks, biographies, and lots of non-fiction categories. Puzzles, DVDs, board games and audio books will also be available, as well as a special section of children's items. Saturday, beginning at noon, will be the day for the bag sale when a bag of books (buyer's choice) will be just two dollars. Please come out and support KAL in the important fundraising endeavor.

(All year long, KAL welcomes donations of books of all kinds including audiobooks, DVDs, children's books and paperbacks, magazines, puzzles, and games. Volunteers regularly sort the donated items, adding some to the library's collection and save the remainder for the library's annual book sale. Kimberling Area Library welcomes donations of books, magazines, puzzles, DVD, and games throughout the year. KAL can provide you with a receipt that you can use for income tax purposes. Book carts are available upon request that you may use to move the donations from your car into the library. We do not accept donations of encyclopedias or textbooks. Due to health reasons, we are unable to accept books and magazines that are moldy or unsuitable for resale.)

Kids Catalog Now Available

Kimberling Area Library is proud to announce the addition of an online “Kids Catalog” to our library system. This new catalog will make it much easier for our younger population to search for books and materials. Children can search by different categories such as boys, girls, bedtime, biographies, fiction, non-fiction, series, and many more. They do not need to know the complete book title or author to use this catalog. Once you click on a category, a list of books pertinent to that category will be displayed. Below is a partial screen shot of the new catalog where you would use the arrows to scan up and down through the categories. If you have questions about the catalog, come by KAL and ask someone at the front desk to show you how it works.

PARTNERSHIPS RAISE FUNDS FOR KAL

As we move into our 29th year, we offer thanks to all our volunteers and supporters who help make Kimberling Area Library one of the best reasons to live in our community. We have many supporters/partners both from area individuals and businesses.

Kimberling Area Library recently partnered with Caring American Thrift Store to help raise funds for the library. Each month the Caring Americans Thrift Store partners with a local charity/non-profit for a day, donating one-half the proceeds from that day to the charity/non-profit. Saturday, July 21st was a special Kimberling Area Library Day at the store and the theme was "Christmas in July." Free hot dogs and hamburgers were available in the parking lot from 11 am to 1 pm and the store offered over 1,000 Christmas-themed items that day as well as some deep discounts in other departments. The event culminated with a donation of \$2,240 being presented to KAL.

Two pre-events were held at the Caring American Store to promote the July 21 event. A "Teddy Bear Picnic Day" was held on Tuesday, July 10 from 10 am to 11 am. Ella Jones was on hand to read to the children. Children were encouraged to bring along their favorite Teddy Bear or other stuffed animal and enjoy a story, a snack, and take home a free book. On July 14 a second event was held for adults when the library offered the opportunity to meet and ask questions of Master Gardener, Kathryn Kuhfal, Kathryn shared a wealth of gardening information and handed out brochures and answered questions to inform and help solve gardening problems.

A big thank you goes to Betty Davis who chaired this event, Connie Wilson, co-chair, and volunteers: Marge Johnson, Dee Veeder, Cathy Freeman, Pam Gramza, Glenda McLauchin, Yvonne Thurman, Debbie Dhul, Ella Jones and Kathryn Kuhfal. LEARNING ON WEDNESDAY

The adult series, Learning on Wednesday (LOW), continues to have interesting topics for upcoming programs. Due to a scheduling conflict there will not be a LOW in September.



The October LOW will be “Hospice: Living, Loving and Making Family Memories” presented by Linda Pedigo and Kerri Stambaugh of Access Hospice in Ozark. Join Linda and Kerri as they discuss: What is hospice and how does it help families with a critically ill loved one? How do Medicare and other supportive services work together to meet desired quality health outcomes for those families? Myths and facts of hospice will be presented for an informed overview of hospice as an end-of-life health care approach. Speakers will also respond to questions posed by LOW attendees that may consider hospice care for a loved one.

On November 13, Kate Morrow will do a presentation on dog training. On December 12, Kay Vinsand with the Stone County Genealogy Society will be the presenter.

Each LOW session is scheduled for 10 am in the KAL community rooms. Everyone is invited to attend, and there is no registration required for this free event.
